Salalah is a rich capital of Dhofar province in southern Oman, rich in culture, history and natural beauty. Visitors will have plenty to enjoy in this ancient seaside town, from the long beaches facing the Arabian Sea to the famous archaeological sites and a bustling city of markets and shops with local food and goods. In the city's historic sites, museums, and cultural centers can be found all over Salalah. An important site to visit is the Sultan Qaboos Mosque, named after the King of Oman. It is an impressive structure in the city centre, which also makes it suitable for shopping and other sights. Another thing to see in the city is the Frankincense Land Museum, which knows that the museum is very good with all the exhibits well displayed and described in English. It features two halls: the Naval Hall and the History Hall, with exhibits showing the region's participation in the ancient spice trade, such as ming porcelain brought by a ship from China and a life-size section of the sail-based stake, where you can stand on top of the deck. The Balina Archaeological Park is one of the most interesting places in the Salalah area. It is the site of the ancient coastal city of Dhofar, which peaked in the 12th century, and trade with Africa, India and China. Its main exports were, of course, frankincense, but they also traded in Arabian horses and gold. The site covers a wide area of 64 hectares with a 2.2 km walking path, allowing visitors to see all the main buildings, including the city wall, the castle and the Grand Mosque. At night the garden lit with Add an interesting atmosphere to the old site. Visitors enjoy arriving late in the afternoon and early in the evening to see them in broad daylight and after dark. Nature and wildlife magasel is a wonderful sandy beach defined by carved cliffs and holes that form in limestone rocks where water plumes can reach a height of 30 meters or more. The unique coastline extends 4 km and is a popular spot for bathing and hiking. Go at high tide to see the sea explode dramatically through rock slabs coming out of the cliffs, detecting many blow holes, the largest of which are covered with metal nets. The view along the coast where the mountains meet on the sea is stunning, and the nearby Magasel Creek is home to a lot of wildlife, especially from the interest of birdwatchers who can see exotic birds such as flamingos, swans, storks and countless migratory birds.
